ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
SOCIETY FOR NEUROSCIENCE

To: The Recorder of Deeds
Washington, D. C.

We, the undersigned natural persons of the age of twenty-one years or over, acting as incorporators of a corporation, adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation pursuant to the District of Columbia Nonprofit Corporation Act:

FIRST: The name of the corporation is Society for Neuroscience.

SECOND: The period of duration is perpetual.

THIRD: The purposes for which the corporation is organized are exclusively scientific, educational, literary, charitable, and no other. In furtherance of only these purposes, the particular business and objectives of said corporation shall be (a) to encourage in the broadest and most liberal manner the increase and diffusion of knowledge of nervous systems, including their roles in

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behavior; (b) to bring together neuroscientists from all relevant disciplines; (c) to facilitate integration of research at all levels of organization; (d) to promote education in the neurosciences; (e) to inform the general public on the results and implications of current research in neuroscience; and (f) to promote such other activities as will contribute to the development of neuroscience, provided that it shall not otherwise engage in activities which in themselves are not in the furtherance of one or more tax exempt purposes, except as same do not represent a substantial portion of its activities.

FOURTH: The corporation shall have members.

FIFTH: The corporation is to have three classes of members: regular members, affiliate members, and student members; only regular members shall have the right to vote on the management of the affairs of the corporation as provided in the bylaws.

SIXTH: The directors of the corporation shall be elected or appointed as provided in the bylaws.

SEVENTH: Provisions for the regulation of the internal affairs of the corporation shall be set forth

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in the bylaws, provided that in the event of dissolution or termination of the corporation, title to and possession of all the property of the corporation shall pass forthwith to such organization or organizations qualified for exemption under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, that in the opinion of the directors is or are best fitted to carry on the purposes of the corporation.

EIGHTH: The address, including street and number, of its initial registered office is 2101 Constitution Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C., and the name of its initial registered agent at such address is R. Keith Cannan.

NINTH: The number of directors constituting the initial Board of Directors is eleven, and the names and mailing addresses of the persons who are to serve as the initial directors until the first annual meeting or until their successors be elected and qualified are:
