



WEATHER FORECASTS

MONDAY, JANUARY 28, 1957

DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA AND VICINITY, overcast with rain today and tonight, high about 42°, low 35°; Tuesday cloudy with rain ending in the afternoon.

MARYLAND, cloudy with occasional rain today and tonight with little change in temperature, highest 35° to 40° in the extreme north and 40° to 45° in central and southern sections, lowest 35° to 40° in the north and 38° to 42° in the south portion; Tuesday cloudy with rain ending in the west portion in the morning and in the east portion in the afternoon.

VIRGINIA, overcast with rain today and tonight with locally heavy rain in the southwest portion, high 38° to 45°, low 35° to 40°; Tuesday cloudy with rain ending in the west portion in the morning and in the east portion in the afternoon.

DELAWARE, cloudy with occasional rain today, tonight and Tuesday with little change in temperature, highest 40° to 45°, lowest tonight 37° to 42°.

THE MAPS shown here are prepared from observations taken daily at hundreds of stations throughout North America. The observations taken at 1:30 a. m. E. S. T., at approximately two hundred selected stations are inscribed on the large surface map of the United States, southern Canada, northern Mexico, and Cuba.

A complete explanation of these maps (including all symbols and tables) is printed frequently on the reverse side. Periodically, during each month, climatological charts and graphs appear in place of the Explanation; and, occasionally, illustrated articles of special meteorological interest are published.
