Whiting, Indiana was completely inundated. In Porter County, a sea wall that protects homes collapsed in Beverly Shores. Lakefront
Drive was closed from Broadway to Dunbar due to large pieces of debris and ice chunks being deposited onto the road by the waves.

Severe erosion at Lake View Beach also forced the closure of the section of Lakefront Drive nearest the beach, east of Broadway. Large ice chunks were deposited by the waves onto Lakefront Drive on the east side of Beverly Shores.
