Near Des Plaines, Central Road was closed between Route 45 and Deerlove Road due to flooding. Near Schiller Park, Irving Park Road was flooded near O'Hare Airport with numerous cars flooded. Lawrence Avenue was closed near Interstate 294 due to a flooded underpass. In Northlake, Grand Avenue was closed due to flooding near Interstate 294.
