The National Weather Service (NWS) encourages the public and our partners  
to utilize redundant information sources, including NWR, to receive NWS  
alerts.

Tsunami alerts broadcast over NWR include Tsunami Watches, Advisories and  
Warnings. NWS has generated maps of NWR coverage overlaid with existing  
tsunami alerting areas that correspond with NWS public weather forecast  
zones. These maps are available for the US Pacific coastlines of Alaska,  
Washington state, Oregon, and California and are online at:
